Skùmaskot combines moody, deep electronic tones with airy vocals, in a style reminiscent of a combination of Billie Eilish and Daughter. The music is tinged with literary fantasy influences (such as J. R. R. Tolkien) as well as epic rhythmic sections like those featured prominently by Imagine Dragons.

The name **Skùmaskot** is Icelandic for **"Suspiciously Dark Corners"**, and was chosen as a tribute to the band Sigur Rós. Skùmaskot's first album - written during the 2020 global pandemic - incorporates **gothic urban feels** with an **indie-pop sound** and even **trap influences**, while bringing attention to the themes of **mental health and anxiety**. A **dystopian**, **postapocalyptic** collection of tales from a world that hasn't quite made it out in one piece.
